## CASTLES - IBM

## LOADING INSTRUCTIONS

- If you will be playing CASTLES from floppy disks, make a backup copy of your CASTLES disks before you begin. (Refer to your user's manual for instructions on how to make backups.) ALWAYS PLAY WITH YOUR BACKUP DISKS ONLY!
- If you are playing from floppy disks, you must also have a blank formatted floppy disk for saving games.
- 3. If you will be playing CASTLES from a hard disk, create a sub-directory (we suggest creating one called CASTLES). For example, to create a sub-directory called CASTLES, you would type:

#### md \CASTLES

(that's md with a space and then \CASTLES) and copy all files from all of the CASTLES disks into it (Refer to your DOS User's manual for instructions on how to create directories and how to copy files).

You will need approximately 1.5 megabytes of disk space free, plus approximately 10 kilobytes of disk space for each saved game.

 Insert your backup of the CASTLES game disk, or if playing on a hard disk, type:

#### CD\CASTLES

5. The first time you play CASTLES, you must run the setup program. Type: **SETUP** 

and press the **Enter** Key. Follow the instructions on the screen. The setup program will configure CASTLES to your system.

If you are not certain which video and sound modes your system has, accept the default selections.

6. You may now type:

#### CASTLES

and press Enter to begin the game.

#### ANSWERING THE COPY PROTECTION QUESTION

Once you've loaded the game, a copy protection question appears in English on the screen. You don't need to be fluent in English to answer correctly. The copy protection questions are numbered. When the question appears on the screen, simply look at page 10 and 11 of this Reference Card for the *number* of the question. For example, if the question was:

#### 16. Who is the Duke of Warfield's eldest son?

you'd look for the question numbered "16". Once you've found the question, type the answer on the same page and press **Enter**. For example, for question 16 above, you'd type **EDWIN** and press **Enter**.

#### STARTING THE GAME

When the Main Menu appears, choose the desired Options.

Press and release the right mouse button (or press the **Z** key if using the keyboard) to trigger the menu. Move the cursor to select 'Labour' from the menu list and then press 'Hire' until it no longer increases the number of workers. This will give you enough labour to start.

Go to the Design menu and plot your castles pieces.

#### THE README.DOC FILE

As important changes are often made to a computer game after the manual goes to the printer, please refer to the Readme.Doc file before running the game.
